Proud History



The rich history of the American Colony dates back to the late nineteenth century, following a series of tragic events that led Horatio and Anna Spafford, a devoutly Christian family, to leave their hometown of Chicago in 1881 in order to find peace in the holy city of Jerusalem and offer aid to families in distress.

Drawing strength through their faith and comfort from the words of the hymn "It is Well with my Soul," written by Horatio following the loss of his four young daughters in a shipwreck, the Spaffords, together with sixteen other members of their church, journeyed to Jerusalem and settled together in a small house in the Old City.

They were never missionaries, but aimed at living as the early Christians did, a simple life with everything in common. With their charitable door open at all times to both their Jewish neighbours and the Bedouin from across the Jordan River, they soon established good relations with the local population and became well known for their acts of benevolence and assistance to the community. People referred to them simply as 'the Americans.' Seventy Swedes living in the United States joined

'the Americans' in 1894 followed by another fifty five two years later, and the now much larger group required a much larger home. The home they finally bought was initially designed as a palace for a pasha and his four wives. That palace would soon become The American Colony Hotel.

The seeds of the American Colony Hotel were sown in 1902, when Baron Ustinov (grandfather of actor Sir Peter Ustinov), finding the Turkish inns of the time unacceptable, needed suitable accommodations in Jerusalem to house his visitors from Europe and America. Before long, the American Colony emerged as a point of lodging for Western travelers and pilgrims whose expectations for high standards of luxury and service were not met by the establishments then existing in Jerusalem.

The American Colony Hotel has a unique place in Israel's history, having endured countless challenges and damage resulting from the area's involvement in a series of wars. It was the venue from which a 'white flag,'—made from a bed sheet from one of the Colony's hospitals that is currently displayed at the Imperial War Museum in London—was draped at the end of World War I to initiate the truce that freed Jerusalem from three centuries of Ottoman rule.

The Colony has always been known as a neutral island, remaining outside the turbulent politics of the land. Owned neither by Arabs or Jews, but by Americans, British and Swedes, it has always had friends from all sectors of Jerusalem's mixed society. An 'oasis' where Jews and Arabs comfortably meet, it is also a favorite haven for international journalists, high-ranking officers of the United Nations and diplomats from across the world.

The original founders retained their former home in the Old City and used it for charitable purposes, providing care to the needy and distressed with services that grew over the decades and today include medical, infant welfare and social work departments.

Although the hotels' active management by the Spafford's grandson, Horatio Vester, was handed over to Gauer Hotels of Switzerland upon his retirement in 1980, the American Colony is still owned by the descendants of the original Founders and its board of directors is composed of family members who remain closely involved. The Colony is a part of their family history, just as it is a part of the history of Jerusalem.



Our Luxurious Rooms

The American Colony consists of 84 rooms in three separate buildings:

The Main Building, the East House and the Palm House, each with its own gardens. In addition, there is a New Wing attached to the Main Building where the Executive rooms are located.

All rooms are designed to provide our guests with the utmost in luxury, comfort and convenience: Each room is fully air-conditioned and has direct dial telephone and voice mail service, Internet access (Broadband), a radio, television with in-house video, free room safe with personal credit card locking system, smoke detectors, full-stocked mini-bar, hair dryer, bathrobe, slippers and amenities tray. Wireless services are provided in public areas of the hotel as well.

The New Wing has been refurbished with all the amenities of a modern hotel, while maintaining the traditional elegance and charm of our 19th century residence.

Our Executive rooms are located in the newest part of the hotel. Each of these rooms is spacious and designed with charming local flavor and character. The fully modern amenities in these rooms comprise the perfect accommodations for business travelers.

The new furniture and decor of our remodeled rooms and corridors reflect the styles of successive periods in the American Colony's long history. 1st FLOOR:

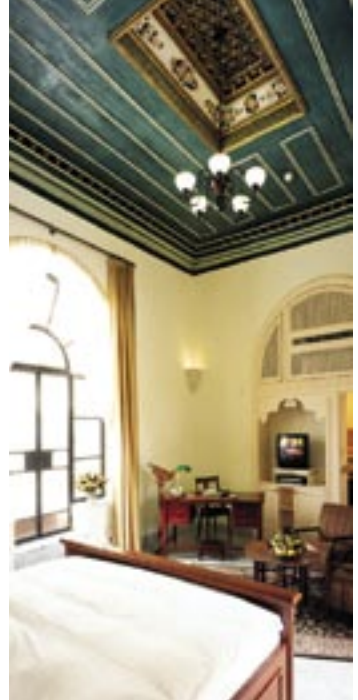
Characterizes the Swedes. These were the pilgrims from Sweden who joined the American Colony in 1896 and brought something of their own culture with them.

2nd FLOOR:

Characterizes the Spafford family from Chicago, who founded the American Colony in 1881. This floor is designed with an 'American touch' of that century.

3rd FLOOR:

Characterizes o the renowned WWI General Lord Allenby, whose soldiers were amongst those nursed by the American Colony when he led the Allied Forces into Jerusalem in 1917. This floor is decorated with a 'British touch.'

4th FLOOR:

Characterizes T.E. Lawrence, or 'Lawrence of Arabia,' a frequent guest of the American Colony in the 1920's. This floor is designed in classic 'Arabic style.'

The Main Building, East House and Palm House consist of very large Pasha Style Rooms, some of which were initially built to order for each of the Pasha's wives-- with painted, high vaulted ceilings, typical of the period. This architectural feature was designed to keep the rooms cool during the blistering summer season and reflect the unique charm of the hotel.

Our Suites, located in both the old and new buildings, each have a distinctive character of their own, yet all share something in common: a spacious sitting room, a large unique bathroom and meticulous attention to individual decor.

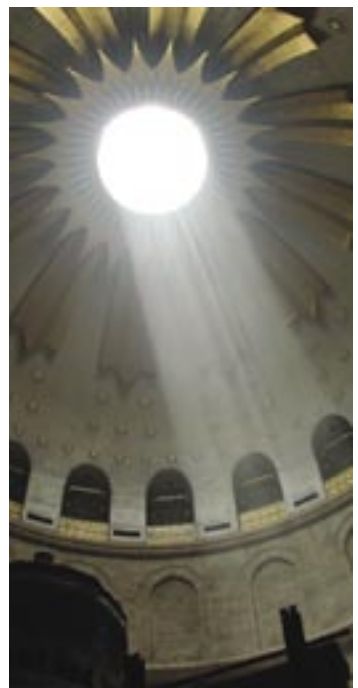
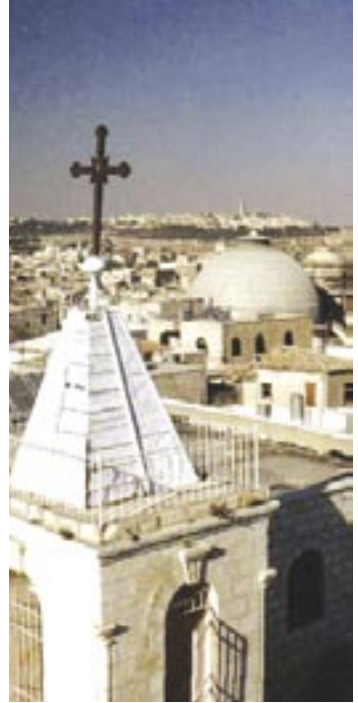

JERUSALEM: A PILGRIMAGE TO THE HOLY CITY

A pilgrimage to the Holy Land has long been enshrined in the traditions of the world's major monotheistic religions. Jews come to visit the tomb of the patriarchs and sages and the Walls of their ancient Temple, Christians come to retrace the footsteps of Jesus and the Moslems come to worship their holy shrines. Israel is a veritable kaleidoscope of history, civilization and religion. Wherever you roam, some momentous event is likely to have taken place there—and no holy pilgrimage is complete without a visit to the "Eternal City" of Jerusalem.

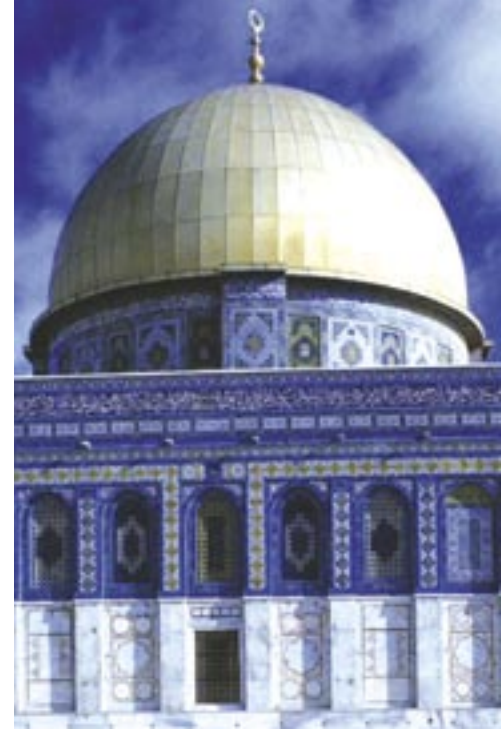
CHURCH OF THE HOLY SEPULCHRE

The holiest site in Christendom, the Church of the Holy Sepulchre is believed to be the site of Jesus' Crucifixion and burial. The history of the church is revealed by its own architectural styles, which emerged from centuries of destruction and rebuilding. The church was first built in the 4th century AD upon the ruins of a Roman temple, after which it was destroyed by Moslem zealots in 1009 and restored approximately forty years later. A new wing was added by the Crusaders in 1099. The church was damaged again by an earthquake in 1927. Its intriguing carved stone portals are the handiwork of Crusader craftsmen from the 12th century.



THE DOME OF THE ROCK ON TEMPLE MOUNT

The Dome of the Rock is an especially striking mosque featuring a beautiful gold dome and remarkable mosaics. This wondrous site was originally built as a shrine in 691 AD in order to protect the rock on the Temple Mount from which, according to Moslem belief, Mohammed ascended to heaven on the back of his horse Al-Barak after meeting with the prophets who preceded him near the Holy of Holies of the Jewish people. The building was designed as an octagon within an octagon with a drum rising above to hold the gold-plated dome. Dazzling blue and gold ceramic tiles cover the upper outer walls, while the lower portion of the wall is covered in marble panels arranged to form symmetric patterns, a reflection of Byzantine art.



THE WESTERN WALL

The Western Wall is the most important site in Jewish history and the holiest place to the Jewish people. According to Jewish belief, the Wall is the sole remnant of the Second Temple that was destroyed by the Romans in 70 AD. Today the Western Wall is a place for prayer and meditation that is of great religious, historical and national significance.

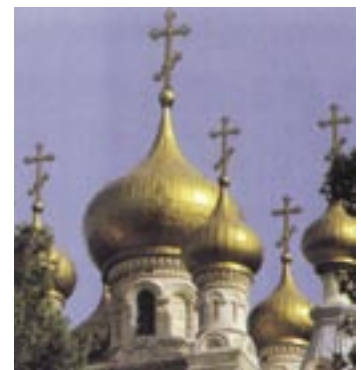


MUSEUMS, CULTURE CENTRES & ART

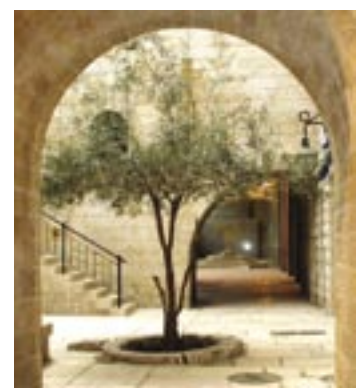
YEAR-ROUND EVENTS

FOREIGN CURRENCY AND VAT REFUNDS

Tourists who purchase goods (with foreign currency) exceeding \$50 in value at shops approved by the Ministry of Tourism are entitled to a VAT (Value Added Tax) refund upon departure from the country. This does not apply to purchases of tobacco products, electrical appliances, cameras, film or other photographic supplies.

Please be sure to obtain an invoice receipt from the shop, indicating the amount of VAT paid. On arrival at Ben-Gurion Airport or the Haifa Port, please refer to Bank Leumi.

At other departure points, the customs official will stamp the invoice and your refund, in the form of a cheque in U.S. dollars, will be sent to your address abroad, as indicated on the invoice.

The Colony is now recognized as one of the most welcoming, important and famous hotels in the Middle East.

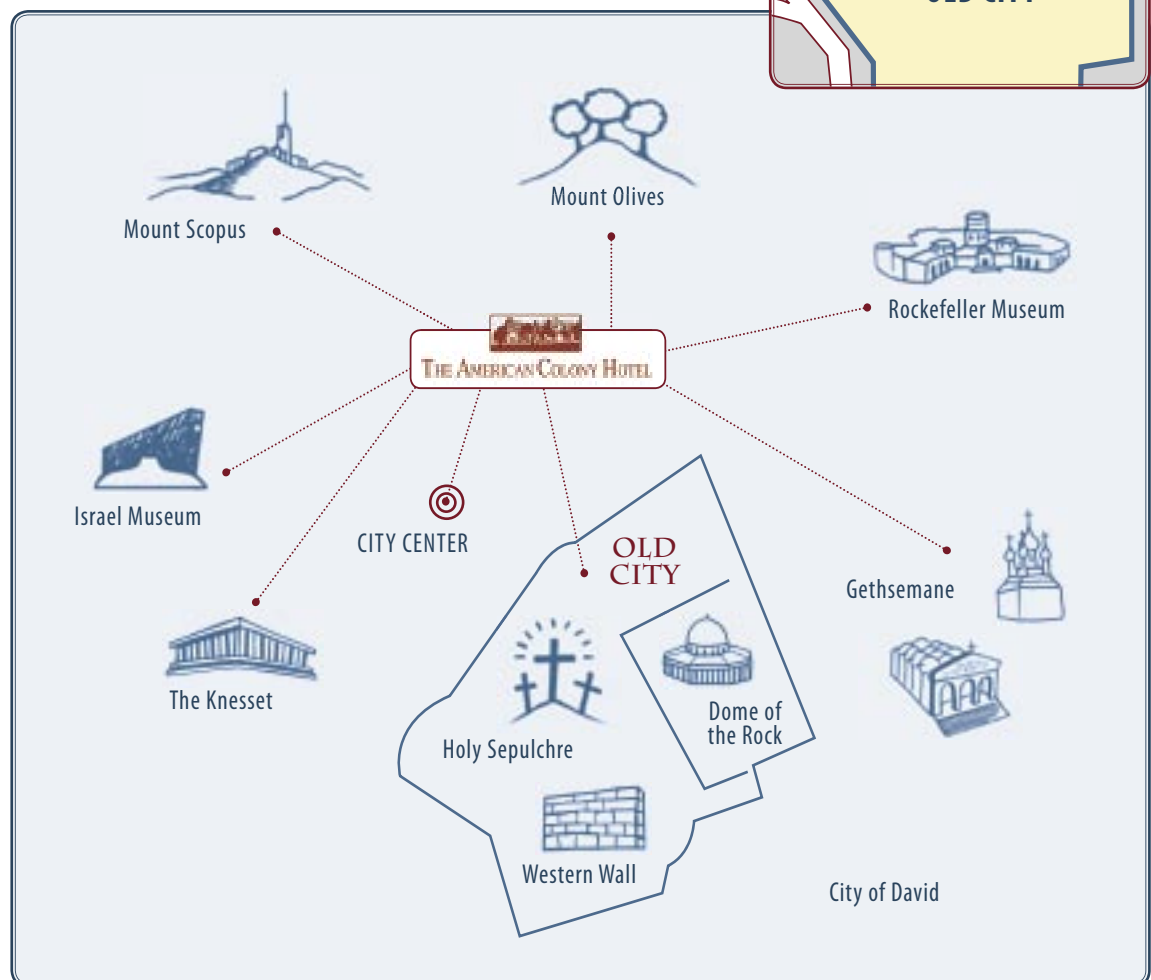
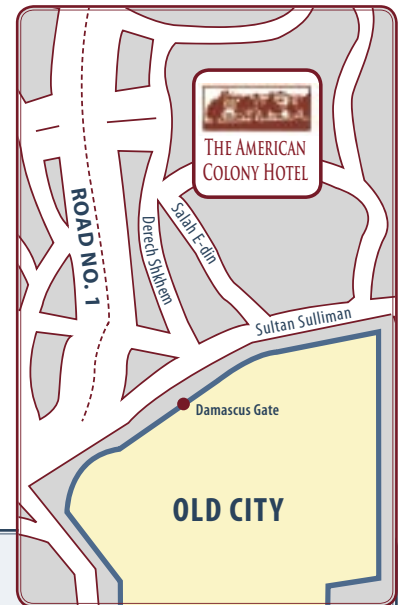


Our Location

DIRECTIONS:

Upon approaching Jerusalem, take the first available left at the traffic light at the big green sign "Begin North." Continue downhill until exit marked "Dead Sea." At second traffic light turn right at small green sign marked "City Center." Follow the road straight, down the hill for about 1.5 kilometers, toward the town center. At the fifth traffic light turn left-at the junction marked with a brown sign pointing to the hotel.
